Jack Dierdorff encouraged and promoted professional growth and development within the commercial real estate industry, making a difference in the lives and careers of many. The BOMI Real Property Administrator designation was initiated during his term as President, and Mr. Dierdorff led the way by earning the RPA designation himself. In 1953, Mr. Dierdorff helped form University Properties, which later became Unico Properties. He retired as Executive Vice President of Unico in 1983, and officially retired in 1992.
