Flood Preparedness

The sooner your business is up and running again, the more likely that your business will remain viable after disasters such as an earthquake, flood, power outage, fire, or a pandemic flu. If you remain unprepared your competition will take your market share

Are you prepared? Do you have a plan? Do you have a kit?



Develop a Business/Corporate Disaster Plan.

- Discard any perishable product that cannot be consumed or moved.
- Create off-site backups of insurance policies, documents, data and other valuables information.
- Move hazardous chemicals and ensure underground storage tanks are sealed and secure.
- Install sump pumps in crawl spaces and basements
- Inspect fire extinguishers and ensure they are fully charged and operational. Water is not ideal for extinguishing all fires and emergency vehicles may not be able to respond to your emergencies.
- Move vehicles and equipment to high ground before flood waters rise.
- Clean-out drains and ensure they are fully operational..
- Raise your furnace, water heater, electric panel, and/or equipment to higher floors or the attic. An undamaged water heater may be your best source of fresh water after a flood.
- Install check-valves in building sewer traps to prevent flood water from backing up into your facility.
- Construct sandbag barriers to stop/prevent flood water from entering the building.
- Seal walls in basements with waterproofing compounds to avoid seepage through cracks.
- Stockpile emergency building materials including: lumber, plywood, plastic sheeting, tarps, roper, nails, hammers, saws, pry bars, sand, shovels, and sandbags.
- Empty dumpsters and place them on high ground to facilitate easy clean-up and prevent silt build-up.
- Secure enough sandbags on hand to protect infrastructure based on a 100 year flood projections.
